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Founders speak

If 2020 was the year of adversity, 2021 is proving to be one of great opportunity. With the pandemic, unprecedented shutdown and move to online classes, we faced several challenges – drop in active student numbers, challenges faced by volunteers in adapting to the online mode, lack of devices and internet access for our students and the constant struggle to ensure our students stayed engaged and progressed in their learning journeys.

But this period of adversity revealed opportunities that we may have never explored in normal circumstances. Our experience with online teaching has helped overcome constraints around location, technology and a limited volunteer base. We used our online experience to grow and in addition to our 20 free learning centers, we now have 12 digital centers, including our first ones outside Mumbai city! With the improving situation, we hope to convert many of these into physical or hybrid centers over the next year.

We have been fortunate to see an expanding base of online volunteers with several students, working professionals and academics now part of our family. This has helped us introduce new programs, including a one-on-one spoken English curriculum for all students from grades 2 onwards. We have also expanded our Youth Engagement Program and School Curriculum coaching to assist our students from grades 8 to 12 studying in English, Hindi and Marathi medium schools.


The online shift has brought new collaborations – we have successfully partnered with Byju's, Vedantu and Embibe for online learning programs. As always, we have found angels all around us who continue to bring joy into the lives of our students through fun programs around dance, music, art and craft as well as assist in health related programs and access to essentials. As we move into the second half of this academic year, we are grateful to be able to impact the lives of around 2,800 students through over 1,800 volunteers. We welcome you all on this journey – may our tribe continue to grow!

Going digital


In addition to our 20 Free Learning Centers (FLCs), 12 new digital centers were established during this academic year. While most centers are operating in an online mode at present, we expect that some will transition to physical classes or operate as hybrid centers as the situation normalizes further.

All centers run English and Mathematics classes based on the AXF curriculum for grades 2 to 7. In addition, under the Youth Engagement Program (YEP) our centers offer tutoring based on school curriculum to students of grades 8 to 12. From this year, we also offer individual, online spoken English sessions to our students.

AXF has expanded its footprint outside Mumbai city for the first time with a digital center each in Pune, Nashik and Bengaluru. We also have volunteers from Dubai who take online classes for students from all over India. Our digital initiatives have helped us regain and now exceed our pre-pandemic student and volunteer numbers.


Our students have received free access to learning applications from Byju's (Grades 10 to 12), Vedantu (Grade 9 English medium) and Embibe by Reliance (Grades 6 to 8). We are excited to see how technology can help tap their learning potential and hope to build on these initiatives in future. Total FLC students - 2,358





Total FLC volunteers - 1,615





Continuing COVID relief efforts

Due to the ongoing impact of the pandemic we decided to continue with our COVID relief efforts at the start of this academic year. We ran a distribution drive during the months of May to August 2021 to raise contributions and assist the families of our students with essential supplies and mobile data recharges. We also arranged for mobile devices to students in need so that they could continue with online learning.

We received substantial support and were able to assist over 2,000 students across our centers. The following is a summary of our distribution efforts:

YEP! We are growing...

Our Youth Engagement Program (YEP) was established in order to improve employability by providing our students with relevant skills. The YEP is divided into the following segments:

- SSC tutoring – online coaching based on school curriculum for students in grades 8 to 10 in order to prepare them for board examinations. At present we have around 650 students in this program across our FLCs and digital centers.
- HSC tutoring program – online coaching based on relevant curriculum for students in the Sciences, Arts and Commerce streams in grades 11 and 12. We also assist students who are interested in attempting competitive examinations such as JEE, NEET, CET, etc. At present we have around 270 students in this program across all centers.

This year we have significantly expanded our SSC coaching to include students across Hindi, Marathi and English medium schools for all subjects.

In addition to academic assistance we run a range of skilling programs that build career awareness and employability in our senior students. These are:

- Career Aware program for grades 9 and 10 and CareerReady program for students of grade 12 and above in collaboration with Antarang Foundation.
- Career guidance session and Volunteer Teacher Training by Shailja Mullay
- Soft skills training in collaboration with PwC and similar organisations
- Employee engagement and volunteering programs by L&T and Morgan Stanley for our spoken English students
- Employability skills workshop by the MBA students of NMIMS
- Career awareness programs in collaboration with Indian Hotels Company
- Digital literacy program in collaboration with UMIT college (SNDT University)
- Scholarship programs in collaboration with EY, Kotak Wealth Management and Udayan Shalini Fellowship program

In addition to the above, students from several Mumbai colleges are also associated with us as volunteer teachers and for extra-curricular activities


Our shining stars ...





Overview of academic performance


Midline academic performance

We held our mid-line examinations during the month of October 2021 for approximately 1,000 AXF curriculum students (Math and English) as well as over 200 SSC and 150 HSC curriculum students. Most of our students participated enthusiastically and gave their best efforts to the examination. However, in this academic year several students continued to face significant challenges in attending classes and appearing for assessments due to the pandemic situation and online format of learning. Some of the common issues faced are highlighted below.

- Online school, online tutoring and online AXF classes resulted in scheduling challenges for several students since they had to juggle multiple online commitments
- There is online fatigue due to the extended pandemic situation. Many of our students are eager to return to a face-to-face learning format as they enjoy the learning experience in person.
- Despite ongoing efforts to assist our students with mobile data recharges and access to devices, many of them face constraints since devices are shared between two or more siblings, parents need to use the devices for work, there is limited connectivity if the students are attending from their hometowns/villages.

Despite these challenges, our students make us proud with their sincerity and commitment to learn. We present below a snapshot of our midline results across all centers and for all our programs.


AXF curriculum mid-line results distribution



Midline academic performance


SSC curriculum midline results distribution

Grades 8 to 10 SSC midline




HSC curriculum midline results distribution








